As the sequel to the Regents class, French 11 offers the more advanced student the opportunity to integrate and solidify the language skills of previous years. In addition, through articles, stories, and films, students develop a rich, precise and idiomatic vocabulary necessary for advanced study. Grammatical and structural topics are reviewed throughout the course of the year within the framework of selected articles and literary pieces.

Each student's individual performance is vital to the success of this class. Student attendance at each class is mandatory for constructive learning experiences. In the foreign language classroom, the class participation grade counts as 25% of the total grade and is based on: punctual arrival to class, timely completion of homework assignments and daily positive participation and contribution in French in all class activities as described in the *Class Participation Rubrics*. The remaining 75% of the grade will be based on written quizzes and exams, essay papers and special projects. Vital to a successful French 11 experience is the student's willingness to participate in all facets of this program. Regular out-of-class preparation is fundamental in order that the student may master the rigors of the curriculum.

French 11 will culminate in a comprehensive final exam in June, which will count as 1/9 of the final grade. This course is also the prerequisite for French12 AP.
